On Saturday 11th April, a Come & Sing with Sir John Rutter CBE took place at Haddo House. This event was in association with Haddo House Operatic and Choral Society (who celebrate their 80th anniversary in 2026) and with Haddo Arts. The sold-out day gave singers the opportunity to work with Sir John on pieces by Verdi, Bruckner, Mozart and Rachmaninov as well as some of his own works, including the Scottish premiere of three of his “Bird Songs”.
