We are pleased to announce that the new academic term will see at least three new tutors offering lessons at NESMS; Fraser Kelman for oboe, Lucy Webster for bassoon and Mark O'Keefe for trumpet. We have also approached several new tutors to give masterclasses and workshops, but they are as yet unconfirmed. As with all our tutors, once Fraser, Lucy and Mark have confirmed their teaching dates, we will let everyone know.

NESMS 50th Anniversary

Plans are afoot to celebrate our 50th year in 2025, but we'd like to hear from past NESMS students, particularly from those who had lessons pre-2000! Fee Increases

Four years on from our last fee increase in 2019 and to keep up with increasing costs, the time had reluctantly come for a further increase. We began a phased £4 increase after the Easter Holidays when a £2 increase of £44/hour took effect. A further £2 increase will also come into effect for the start of the next academic term from 1st August 2023 onwards.

As many of you are aware, lesson fees alone do not cover the ever increasing costs of running the school. Since our founding in 1975 we have been heavily dependent on sponsorship and donations from charitable trusts and foundations as well as private individuals and local businesses – and of course fundraising by the Friends of NESMS – in order to continue to bring your tutors to Huntly Street on a regular basis.

We had frozen all fees at the start of lockdown and throughout the pandemic when we were under Government restrictions and all became heavily reliant upon online teaching. We also increased the tutors pay at the start of this calendar year to better equate to the current Musicians Union rate which is why a phased, but overdue increase, began before the end of the current Academic year.

Assistant Manager moving on

Sadly our assistant Manager, Chloe Gordon will be leaving us during the summer as she approaches the end of her Masters in Music at the University of Aberdeen. Chloe started the position online amid lockdown restrictions back in January 2021 and eventually met everyone as in-person lessons slowly returned. From website redesigning, overhauling the Scholarship Audition timetabling system and completing the mammoth task of the library stocktake (of over 8500 items!), Chloe has definitely left her mark in the future of NESMS.

An advert for her replacement is now in circulation and we hope to appoint someone before the start of the new academic year.

NESMS may be a small organisation but we're always looking to engage with more and more people. Library music

Now that the Library stock take has been completed, we can now focus on reducing the number of duplications, particularly in the vocal section of the library. We will be aiming to keep just three copies of any opera/operetta/oratorio score so that one may be out on loan, with two available for lessons. Where we can, these will be three of the same editions; nothing worse than using different copies with mismatched page numbers during a lesson! Similarly we will also aim for those pieces in the vocal single sheet music section that are published in various keys, to have three copies of each published key.

The excess duplicates will join our permanent and ever-changing music sale. Look out for us advertising a music sale day or two coming near the start of the new term.

Hire a NESMS studio

21 Huntly Street has long returned to being a busy hive of musical learning but we still try to accommodate anyone wishing to rent a NESMS studio where we can. Perhaps for a quick practise on your lunch hour, a private practise room away from busy homes, or a rehearsal venue for you and your accompanist to practise for exams or concerts. From August onwards all studios for individuals will now be £8.50/hour. Anyone wishing to hire a studio should book in advance via the NESMS office.
