The July concert, *Summer Strings*, featured Caitlin Williams, violin, Gemma Ramsay, cello with Daniel Silcock, piano and a programme of Bach, Brahms, Tchaikovsky and Saint-Saëns. NESMS vice-president and Head of Keyboard at Chetham's School of Music, Murray Mclachlan had previously offered online sessions for students during the pandemic but this was his first time back in the building for a few years. We are planning for both Lyn and Murray to each return with an open masterclass before the end of the Academic Year.
